






After-tax corporate profits, quarterly data, in billions. (SOURCE: BEA)








Figure 4. Tone of President's News Coverage during First 100 Days










President Elect Transition Team




Cumulative Cost of Regulation




The Cost of Regulations:

If the cost of regulatory accumulation (\$4 trillion) were a country, it would have the 4th largest GDP in the world.











Report: Mismatch of skills and mission at FCC FCC ranks #23 of 26 similar sized agencies as a good place to work

- Declining workplace satisfaction 2013-2016
- 1600 total employees (\$250k/person overhead)
- Not enough technical staff for mission critical functions
- ➢ 600 lawyers
- > 250 engineers
- 50 economists
- Lack of team leadership from previous Chairman
- Lack of respect for employees

50 Actions in First 100 Days at FCC

Closing Digital Divide

- Reverse auction with \$4.53B for 4G in rural America
- \$2B competitive bid for wired broadband
- Fast track copper to fiber transition
- Plan for small cells, 5G
- Broadband Deployment Advisory Committee

Enhancing transparency and accountability

- Make all proposals public 3 weeks before vote
- Create office of
 economics and data

Reduce regulatory burdens

- Reduce \$800M in compliance paperwork
- Relieved small providers of Open Internet
- reportingEnd 12 yr bus
- End 12 yr business data services proceedings
- Common accounting rules
- Ease reporting burdens for volunteer board members of noncommercial broadcasters

Promoting innovation

- Ease application for new experiments
 - Authorized LTEU
 - devices in 5 GHz band;
 - Allow television broadcasters nextgeneration TV standard;
- Closed investigation into free-data as no harm found

Other

- Concluded world's first ever incentive auction
- Launch process to restore Internet Freedom to light touch regulation


Protecting consumers and public safety

- Safe harbor to block
 Robocalls
- Fined company \$1 million for cramming
- Improved quality of video relay services for deaf, hard-of-hearing, and speech disabled
- Allow jails to detect and block the use of contraband phones
- Help law enforcement with bomb threats at houses of worship
- Blue Alerts program to inform public of threats to safety and law enforcement


Denmark, smørrehul of telecom

- Some of lowest prices in EU and world
- Highly competitive market
- Robust market for application development
- Reflects stable, multi-party consense for market-led, technologyneutral approach to telecom policy




US and EU in Global Perspective

Per Capita Private Broadband Investment


